Conserve cultural heritage value and heritage attributes by providing guidelines on how to manage change consistently











Old Oakville Heritage Conservation District Plan

Town of Oakville Initiative

- Original plan dates to 1982
- Served community well in preserving unique character of an area that mirrors the evolution of Oakville from its beginning to small town
- Requires updating
 - Ontario Heritage Act
 - Best Practices

- Developed partnership with OHS (and Town) for block analysis and built inventory research




- Scan of latest HCD plans and best practices across Ontario


